**PAC Meeting Purpose and Scope.** The role of the Parent Advisory Committee (PAC) is to provide advice to the Redding School District governing Board and superintendent on the District's Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP). The LCAP is a document that memorializes the District's goals for student achievement, action items to achieve the goals, and performance metrics to assess the District's progress on reaching these goals. The LCAP should provide public stakeholders a clear picture on how Redding School District is spending their state-allocated funds in order to meet State and local priorities for student achievement. PAC meetings engage parents in the public process for reviewing and commenting on the District's LCAP.

#### 3. Local Control Accountability Plan Draft

- a. Cindy invited parents of the PAC to attend the two Board Meetings in June, where the Draft LCAP will be presented to the Board and then voted on to Adopt
- b. First Board Meeting: Tuesday, June 21<sup>st</sup> starting at 4 p.m. in the District Office boardroom (Draft LCAP presented to Board, and stakeholders can engage in the public process by making comments/feedback on the District LCAP at this time)

- c. Second Board Meeting: Tuesday, June 28<sup>th</sup> starting at 5:30 p.m. in the District Office boardroom (Draft LCAP will be voted on to Adopt)
- d. Cindy gave a in depth run through of the Draft LCAP and said that the draft feedback section had been updated from the last time we reviewed together
  - i. Summary of the feedback section was updated based on information/feedback provided by specific educational partners, such as the Redding Teachers Association (RTA) and Classified staff - California School Employees Association (CSEA) and the Parent Advisory Committee (PAC)
  - ii. In the past Redding School District had a 3 year - Strategic Plan, now RSD has a 3 year Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP)
  - iii. Current 3 year LCAP 21/22, 22/23 & 23/24 (Each year the District reviews the Goals/Actions and updates the LCAP with the Year 1, 2 or 3 Outcomes
  - iv. LCAP 2022-23 Sections in plan:
    - 1. General Information
    - 2. Reflections: Successes
      - a. Decrease in overall suspension
      - b. Special Education celebrate more students in classrooms
    - 3. Reflections: Identified Needs
      - a. Math scores for 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup>
      - b. CORE Math training 4<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> teachers (12 employees completed the CORE Math online Asynchronous Course)
      - c. Backwards map standards and see where supplements need to be added
      - d. Students need to understand fractions to do well in Algebra, so the use of manipulative will be implemented

    - 5. Comprehensive Support & Improvement
      - a. Redding Achieve was identified as a Comprehensive support and Improvement (CSI) school in the area of suspension based on the California Dashboard data from the year of 17-18
      - b. Redding Achieve is locked into CSI status due to Covid set back to the Dashboard data being put on hold. RA have made improvement in the area of suspension and will be exited out of CSI status once the Dashboard data is updated with new baseline info from 21/22 and 22/23 school year reflects the

improvement in suspension rate
